Dear Mr. President:

This letter is prompted by the recent action of the Department of Justice on the South Florida Chapter of the Associated General Contractors, Inc., v. Metropolitan Dade County, Florida raises a number of serious issues which may affect not only the future of your administration, but how it is ultimately viewed by historians. I shall return to the case cited above shortly. At this point I want to pause and reintroduce myself and you will understand the reason for my concern.

I joined the Republican Party in the state of Kansas in 1948. I was a college student at the time and I have been active in the party affairs from that day to the present. Besides being a party worker in Kansas, California and the state of Washington, I have served as a political appointee in Kansas and Washington state government, a sub-cabinet office in the Nixon Administration, a White House Deputy Assistant to the President in the Ford Administration, and Alternate Delegate to the United Nations when Vice-President George Bush was the U. S. Ambassador to that body. I was also minority affairs consultant to the Republican National Committee when the Vice-President served as the GOP National Chairman. I have served as an elected city councilman in the state of Washington, was a candidate for state wide office in that state in 1968, and the GOP candidate for mayor of the District of Columbia in 1978.

Mr. President, I have participated in every national election since joining the party. For example, in 1980 I spent the month of September, serving as a surrogate speaker for the Reagan-Bush ticket. I made two trips to California to help Bob Tuttle, Jr., and others in the Los Angeles and San Francisco Bay areas. In October, when the Carter Campaign organization accused you of being a KKK sympathizer and started attacking your civil rights record as Governor of California, I joined the GOP Congressional Truth Squad. I spent the month of October campaigning throughout the country with Secretary Elizabeth Dole, Senator Tower and other distinguished members of Congress and/or former cabinet officers. My task was to explain your domestic policies and
