O'Connell Tops Campaign Expenditure List

OLYMPIA (UPI)—Gov. John J. O'Connell spent more than a quarter of a million dollars before the Sept. 17 primary election in his successful bid for the Democratic gubernatorial nomination.

Campaign expense statements the Nov. 5 general election. O'Connell, secretary of State A. Evans' campaign, indicated O'Connell's campaign expenditures were \$189,918 while O'Connell's opponent, Republican challenger Gov. Dan Evans, spent \$61,573. Total was \$251,491. Behind O'Connell, the second highest spender was State Sen. Fred Dore, who spent more than \$1 million by the end of Jack Metcalfe's

reported polling out \$25,287 to gain the Republican nomination for the U.S. Senate. In the attorney general's race, statements filed Friday showed that State Sen. Fred Dore, D-Seattle, spent \$58,304, and Mayor Lynn Durning, Seattle attorney, spent \$9,370, in their unsuccessful bids for the Democratic nomination.

Also leading to file statements were Republican candidates Tony Chale, 8th District; Mike O'Neil, 2nd District, and Ray Tansley, 14th District, and Democratic congressional candidate Ted McQuay in the 2nd District.

Other campaign statements filed Friday were Gov. John Chaskey, Democrat, spent \$411,000 for his bid while Art Fletcher, Republican who will be challenged by Berg, spent \$18,300.

Robert Eberle, Republican congressional nominee, 7th District, spent \$12,300.

In the 1st District for the Republican congressional nomination, the Rev. Adams, Vancouver, spent \$69 while his unsuccessful opponent, R. C. (Skip) McCann, reported \$36,583 in expenditures.

The campaign expense statements do not contain details of campaign contributions or other financial matters.
