Dear Mr. Fletcher:

On June 30, 1992 you submitted the Public Financial Disclosure Report for calendar year 1992. In Schedule A and Part II of Schedule B you stated that for further details see the enclosed Attachments. Assuming that the Attachments were missing due to an oversight I called your Assistant, Renata House, and asked her to send them. Ms. House informed me that the attachments had yet to be prepared.

During the last six months I personally requested on various occasions that this information from both you and Ms. House. In addition, at my request the Staff Director, Mr. Wilfredo J. Gonzalez, asked you to submit this information. Despite these efforts you have failed to submitted the required information.

It is therefore my obligation as Designated Ethics Officer for the agency that unless this information is submitted within the next 30 days the matter will be referred to the Department of Justice. The Attorney General may bring a civil action against any individual who knowingly and wilfully fails to report this type of information. The penalty for failure to submit this information can be as high as \$10,000. See 5 U.S.C. App 104(a).
