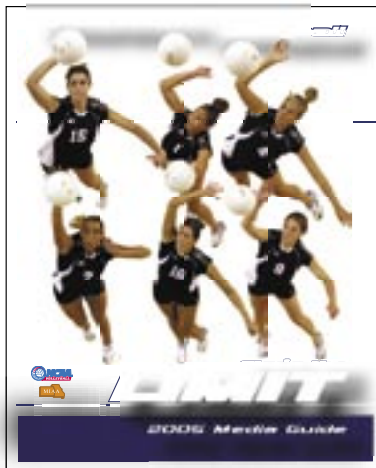

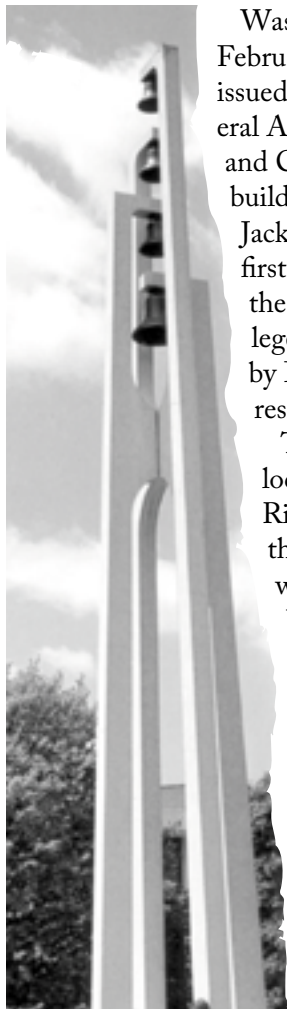

Washburn University was established in February 1865 as Lincoln College by a charter issued by the State of Kansas and the General Association of Congregational Ministers and Churches of Kansas. A two-story brick building on the northeast corner of 10th and Jackson Streets was soon erected and the first classes began in January 1866. In 1868, the school was renamed Washburn College, in recognition of a \$25,000 donation by Ichabod Washburn, a church deacon and resident of Worcester, Mass.

The university was granted a permanent location in 1865 when Topekan Col. John Ritchie donated a 160-acre site, which at the time was a considerable distance southwest of the city. Construction on the first building began in 1872, with occupancy

taking place in 1874. For the next two decades, college President Peter MacVicar conducted an aggressive development campaign. His efforts resulted in the establishment of numerous Victorian limestone structures which characterized the campus for the next 90 years.

Expansion of the school was constant. The School of Law was organized in 1903, as was a School of Fine Arts and a medical school, which educated physicians until 1913. During the next three decades structures such as the Mulvane Art Museum, Benton Hall and Whiting Field House were added to the campus. In June 1966, a tornado struck Topeka and several historic buildings on campus were demolished. The Washburn community rallied and financial support from friends and alumni made possible the rebuilding of many school facilities during the coming years.



Today, university facilities offer more than one million square feet of modern academic and support space.

In 1941, the citizens of Topeka endorsed Washburn by voting to establish a municipal university, supported in part by the city and governed by a local board of regents.

In 1952, the Washburn Board of Regents officially changed the name of the school to Washburn University of Topeka. In 1999, the university's primary funding was moved from city property tax to county sales tax sources, with the school retaining status as a municipal subdivision of the state.

In addition to local financial support, Washburn has received state funds since 1961, which have been coordinated by the Kansas Board of Regents since 1991. Washburn is governed by its own nine member Board of Regents.

Washburn provides broadly-based liberal arts and professional education through more than 190 certificate, associate, baccalaureate, master's and juris doctor programs through the College of Arts and Sciences and the Schools of Law, Business, Nursing and Applied Studies. Ninety-seven percent of the faculty hold a doctorate or the highest degree available in their discipline.

Loren Ferré became Washburn's director of athletics in February of 1996 after a six-year appointment at Black Hills State University in Spearfish, S.D. Ferré is a dynamic leader who has implemented many internal changes within the athletic department since arriving on campus. He has put increasing scholarships and departmental fund-raising at the top of his list.

This past season, Ferré was named the Central Region Athletic Director of the Year.

At Washburn, Ferré has been instrumental in the establishment of a strong Ichabod Club support team and the raising of funds for athletic scholarships.

While at BHSU, Ferré was also director of the Donald E. Young Sports Fitness Center, a 172,000 square foot, \$10.2 million facility. During his Black Hills tenure, the athletics department nearly tripled its outside revenue, including large increases in ticket sales and scholarship funding. All 10 varsity teams won a conference title in his final three years.

Before joining the staff at Black Hills State, Ferré spent 17 years at the University of North Texas. He was the director of the Coliseum (1987-90) and was the associate and assistant director since 1980. He held the post of event coordinator (1978-80).

Ferré is a 1971 graduate of Texas Christian University, earning a bachelor of arts degree. He earned a master's in journalism from North Texas in 1982.

Ferré has just finished a three-year term as Chair of the NCAA Division II Men's Basketball South Central Regional Chairman.

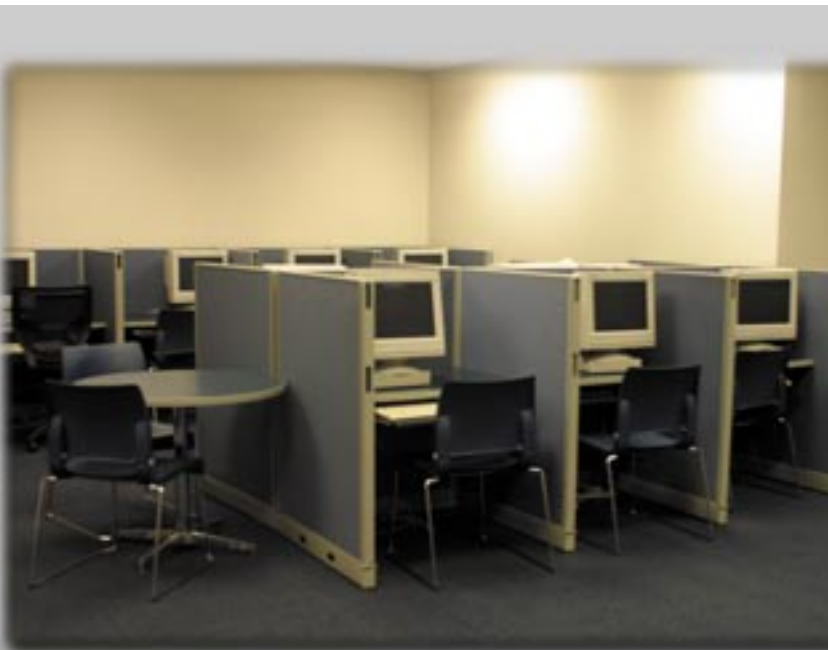

Lee Arena has served as the home of Washburn volleyball since the 1984 season. The arena has a capacity of 3,904, twice that of Whiting Fieldhouse, which housed the home court prior to 1984.

Lee Arena has provided an outstanding homecourt advantage for both the Ichabods and Lady Blues volleyball and basketball squads.

Washburn owns a 93-81 record (no records kept until 1990) in Lee Arena, but the Lady Blues have had winning marks in the arena five of the last six seasons. Washburn's best mark was a 11-1 mark in 2004.

The Lady Blues have gone 22-5 the last two seasons and hosted the 2002 South Central Region Tournament in Lee Arena. Washburn clinched its first MIAA title Nov. 16, 2002 in Lee Arena against

Pittsburg State.

On July 6, 1999, Lee Arena was fitted with a new court design. The previous design was the original found on the court when Lee Arena opened for a basketball game on Nov. 17, 1984.

The new court, which was designed by Sports Information Director Gene Cassell, features major changes, including a filled-in 3-point circle and an enlarged Washburn "W" in the center of the court.

The arena was built as part of the \$8.4 million Kelsey

H. and Edna B. Petro Allied Health Center, the largest building on campus covering more than 126,000 square feet. Lee Arena is named after former Washburn baseball coach and player Bob Lee and his wife, Sallee, to recognize their \$250,000 donation.

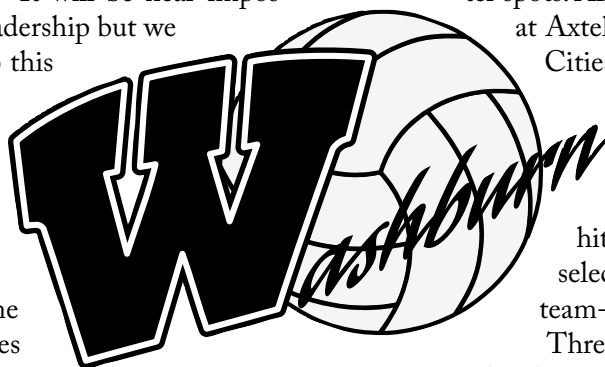

After losing five starters, including the school's only All-American in the program's history, the Lady Blues have reloaded the roster for the 2005 season.

Two-time All-American Dani McHenry and fellow All-MIAA first teamer on the outside Emily Foster, second team middle hitter Katie Brandt and honorable mention all-league libero Wendy Kobbeman capped their careers with a second trip to the national tournament in just three seasons. Sophomore All-MIAA setter Julie Sackman also will not return this fall.

"Our senior class from last year was not only a talented group but some of the best people I've been associated with," said coach Chris Herron. "It will be near impossible to replace their skills and leadership but we look forward to our young group this season."

To compete in the MIAA this season, Herron will have to rely on a group of just six returning players, including just four that saw significant time last fall. The squad has added nine newcomers leaving the Lady Blues with only one upper classman in one junior Valerie Peterson.



The Returners

Of the returning positions, the Lady Blues may have the most depth returning at middle hitter. Sophomores Anna Byers and Mandi Cox shared a starting spot as freshman and posted solid numbers offensively with .244 and .277 hitting percentages respectively. Byers was second on the team with 107 blocks (1.03 blocks per game).

Monica Miesner stepped into a starting role as a freshman as well last fall and is the top returnee in kills with 198. Miesner stepped in on the right side and added 167 digs and 55 blocks. This season she will look to return to the outside hitter position.

Peterson, the squad's most only upperclassman as a junior, specialized in serving for the Lady Blues last season. Despite somewhat limited action, Peterson had 23 service aces. Sophomores Ashley Ruzick and Erica Cowhick will look to add depth and challenge for playing time this season.

The Newcomers

The squad has added nine newcomers, including three transfers and six freshman to the mix this season. Several will be asked to make immediate impact and will be looked on for a leadership role early on.

Transfers Tessa Jones and Andi Moran are transferring from Division I schools Kansas and Dayton respectively. Jones, a 6-0 middle/outside hitter was a three-time all-state selection at Kansas City, Mo.'s O'Hara High School before playing one season at Kansas. Moran, was a medical redshirt at Dayton last season after a stellar high school career at Mehlville High in St. Louis, Mo. Moran will compete for the starting setter role.

Sophomore outside hitter Bailey Saal will join the Lady Blues after one season at Des Moines Area Community College. Saal led DMACC in kills and was named to both the all-conference and regional all-tournament team.

Two freshman will add depth and size to the front line for the Lady Blues. 5-11 Joanna Alfors and 6-2 Stephanie Nitz will compete for time at the middle and outside hitter spots. Alfors was a three-time all-state pick at Axtell High, while Nitz was the Quad Cities Player of the Year for Moline (Ill.) High in 2004 after breaking the school record with 277 kills. Freshman Bobi Riley, who will contend for an outside hitter spot, was a first team all-state selection at Lawrence High with a team-high 257 kills.

Three other freshman will join the Lady Blues as specialists. Stephanie Holub and Kelli Peterson will contend for defensive specialist/libero starting roles. Holub helped Blue Valley West to two state titles and led the league with 292 digs, while Peterson was a first team All-Metro selection at Shawnee Mission Northwest High School. Setter Carolyn Raynes, a high school teammate of Riley, was a two-time all-league selection at Lawrence High and helped the Lions to a second place finish at 6A State in 2004.

The Outlook

After placing all four of its teams in the South Central Region semifinals, the MIAA race will be as tough as ever this season. Truman State, national runner-up in 2004, returns five starters and looks to be the favorite despite losing MIAA Coach of the Year Qi Wang to Northern Michigan. Central Missouri State returns five starters from last year's team that finished ninth in the AVCA National Poll. Pittsburg State returns three starters from its regional semifinal team.

Washburn opens the season in a familiar place Aug. 26 in the Missouri Southern Tournament in Joplin, Mo. The Lady Blues opening with South Central Region foe Henderson State and look to try to duplicate last year's early season success despite losing six key players. To succeed they will ask a group of young, but talented, players to grow up fast.

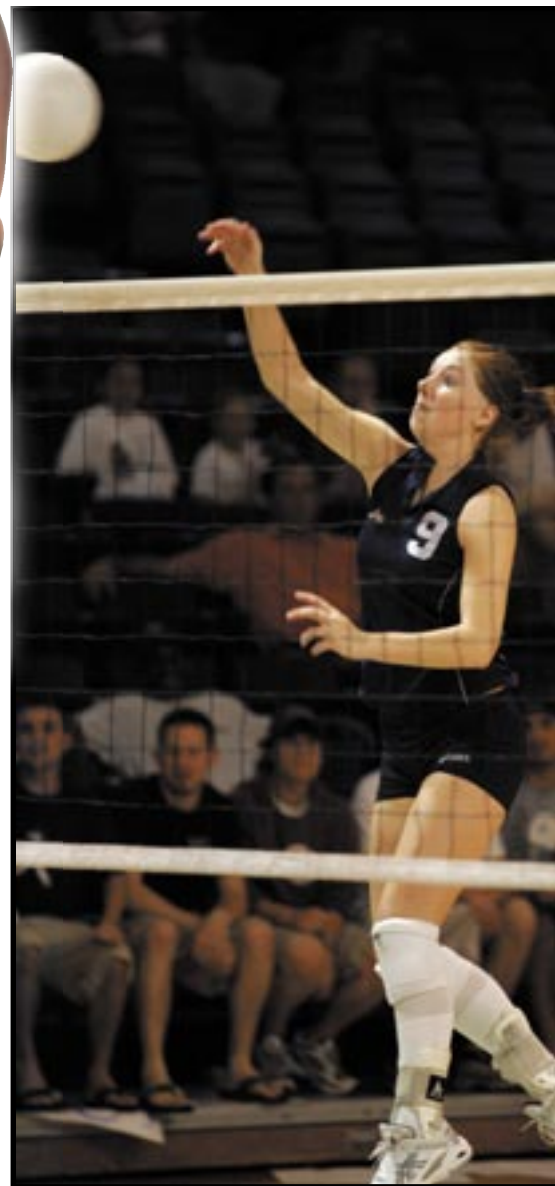

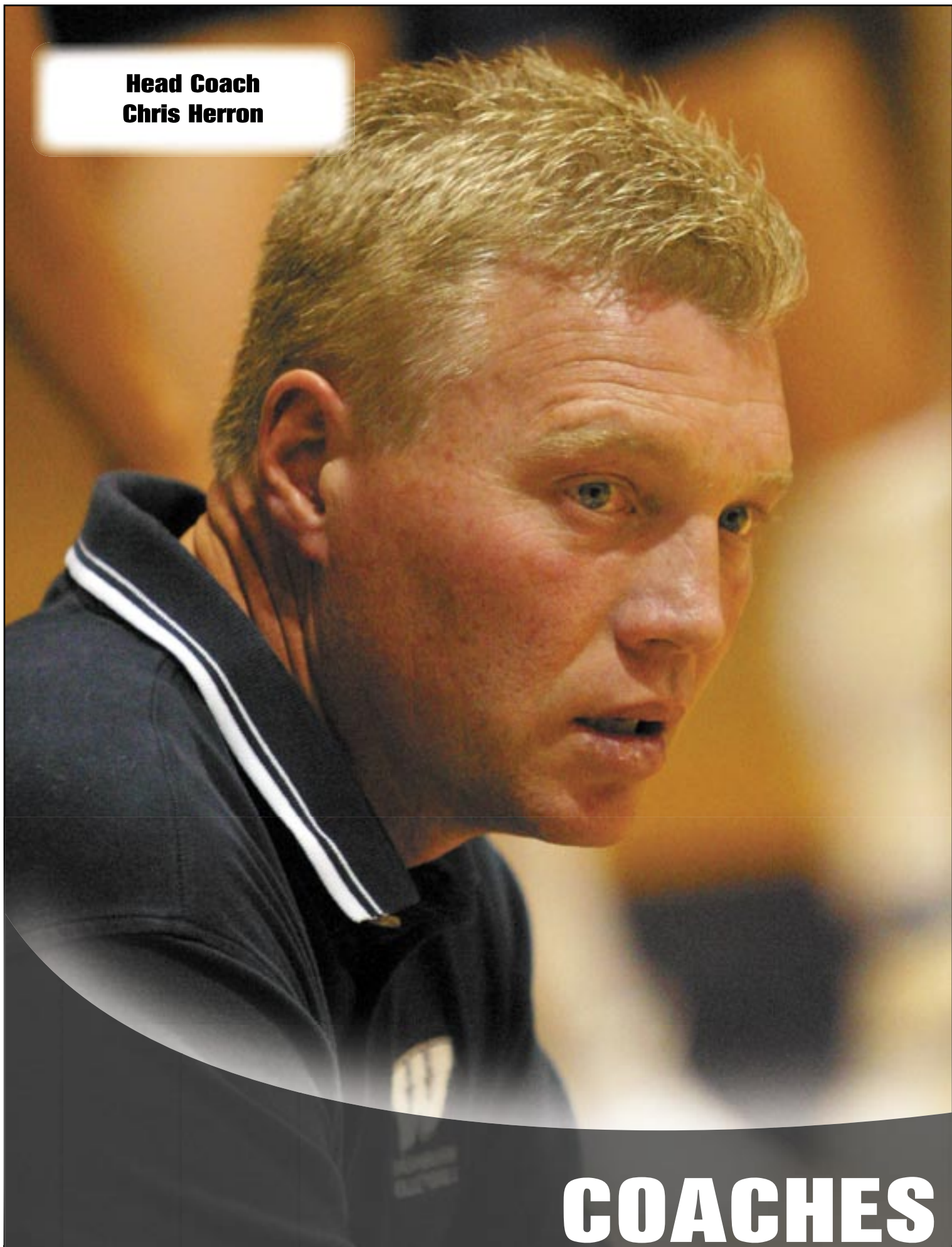

Washburn head coach Chris Herron is in his fourth season at Washburn after leading the Lady Blues to the top two winningest seasons in school history. He has a 84-22 combined record at Washburn.

In his first season, Herron took the Washburn program to new heights winning its first MIAA Championship and its first appearance in the NCAA Playoffs with a 29-5 record. He was named MIAA Coach of the Year.

The Lady Blues also entered the AVCA Division II Top 25 for the first time in school history during the 2002 season and the 2004 team finished with a school-best No. 16 ranking in the AVCA National Poll. He led the Lady Blues to their first NCAA Tournament victory with a 3-1 win over Harding in the first round of the 2004 tournament.

In his second season in 2003, Herron led Washburn to a 26-10 record. The Lady Blues started 15-1 and were ranked as high as No. 19 in the country before injuries derailed their shot at postseason play.

Herron was named head coach of the Washburn volleyball team March 25, 2002.

Herron spent the previous three seasons as the head coach of Benedictine College, where he compiled a 75-29 record. After going 13-15 in his first year in 1999, Herron guided the Ravens to their first-ever Heart of America Athletic Conference title and the squad's highest win total ever with a 30-8 record in 2000.

He led the Ravens to a 32-6 record last fall and garnered HAAC Coach of the year honors for the second straight season. The squad also won its first-ever HAAC Postseason Conference Tournament championship in 2001.

Benedictine also cracked the national top 25 poll for

the first time in school history, by finishing 23rd in the final NAIA rankings.

Herron spent 13 years prior to going to Benedictine as the head coach at Tonganoxie High School. During that time Herron's teams posted an overall record of 366-88. He began his coaching career at Golden City High School in Golden City, Mo., where he posted a 21-17 record in two seasons from 1984-85.

Two of his teams received the state's highest award of "Program of the Year" in 1989 and 1996 from the Kansas Volleyball Coaches Association. He also led four of his teams to the state tournament.

Herron also coached USAV juniors volleyball for 14 winters. His last two teams were Heart of America Region 18 Champions. His teams have made four National Tournament appearances, in 1993, 1999, 2000, 2001.

He is a 1980 graduate of the College of the Ozarks, where he earned a bachelor's of science in physical education.

Herron lives in Topeka with his wife, Julie, daughter Libby and sons Thatcher Cole and Jordan.

REVIEW

The Washburn Lady Blues shattered many team records en route to a 29-7 record and second appearance into the NCAA Division II National Tournament in 2004.

The Lady Blues opened the season by sweeping through competition at three tournaments and the first two matches of the conference season to set a school record with a 14-0 mark.

Washburn beat Cameron and Regis 3-1 in the first day of the Rockhurst Invitational before sweeping Northwest Missouri State and Texas Woman's University 3-0 the second day. Katie Brandt and Emily Foster were named to the all-tournament team.

The Lady Blues followed with another four wins at the Central Arkansas Invitational Sept. 3-4. The Lady Blues swept Southern Arkansas, Alabama-Huntsville and West Alabama before beating host Central Arkansas 3-1. Brandt and Foster were named to the all tournament team again. Julie Sackman was also named to the all-tournament team and was named MIAA Specialist of the Week.

After a win over William Woods in the home opener on Sept. 7, Washburn cruised through the West Florida Invitational.

Washburn swept Ouachita Baptist and Albany State and topped host West Florida 3-1 in the Invitational. Katie Brandt had 50 kills in the three matches with a .413 hitting percentage to be named the Most Valuable Player of the Invitational. She was also named MIAA Hitter of the Week. Wendy Kobbeman and Dani McHenry were named to the all-tournament team, while Julie Sackman was named MIAA Specialist of the Week for the second straight week

The Lady Blues followed with wins over Missouri Western 3-0 and at Northwest Missouri State 3-2 to improve to 14-0 to begin the season. The Lady Blues suffered their first loss at No. 3 Truman State 3-1 on Sept. 18.

Washburn setter Julie Sackman suffered a stress fracture injury to her foot that sidelined her for about a month during the MIAA season.

Backup Ashley Smith stepped in and led Washburn to three straight wins over Missouri Southern, Southwest Baptist and No. 18 Pittsburg State. Smith was named MIAA Specialist of the Week for her performance.

The Lady Blues fell at No. 9 Central Missouri State 3-0 on Sept. 28 despite a career-high 24 kills by Emily Foster. Foster followed with 14 kills in a 3-0 sweep over Emporia State the following match. She finished the week with 38 kills and hit .432 to earn MIAA Hitter of the Week and AVCA Division II National Player of the Week honors.

The Lady Blues picked up their second win over a nationally-ranked team with 3-2 comeback win over No. 22 Rockhurst in Lee Arena Oct. 7. The Lady Blues fell behind 13-9 in the fifth game before winning 16-14. Dani McHenry led the way with 25 kills.

McHenry later earned MIAA Hitter of the Week honors with a 28-kill performance at Pittsburg State Oct. 23.

The Lady Blues topped No. 7 Central Missouri State 3-2 in Lee Arena Oct. 26 in front of a regular season-record 985 fans.

The Lady Blues finished the regular season with a 27-5 record and a school-record No. 15 AVCA ranking.

Washburn got its first-ever win in NCAA Tournament play with a 3-1 win over Harding Nov. 18 in the South Central Regional quarterfinals in Kirksville, Mo. The Lady Blues followed with a 3-0 loss to CMSU to finish the season 29-7.

Katie Brandt had 30 kills in the two matches to earn All-South Central Regional Tournament honors. The Lady Blues finished the season with a No. 16 ranking in the AVCA National Poll, which was the best finish in school history.

Dani McHenry, who became the first Lady Blue in school history to earn AVCA All-American honors as a junior in 2003, earned third team All-American honors as a junior.

McHenry broke her own record for kills per game with 4.36 kills per game and finished with 534 kills.

McHenry was joined on the AVCA All-South Central Region team by Emily Foster and Katie Brandt.

McHenry and Foster were first team All-MIAA picks, while Brandt was named to the second team. Wendy Kobbeman and Julie Sackman were named to the honorable mention team.

McHenry, Foster and Valerie Peterson were named to the MIAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll.

The Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association, a nine-member conference of NCAA Division II institutions in Missouri and Kansas, was first organized in 1912 as the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association.

Over the past 20 years, the league has undergone several changes, highlighted by increased participation in national championships.

The MIAA has gained the reputation of being one of the top NCAA Division II conferences in the nation. MIAA student-athletes have won 13 national team championships and 141 individual national titles.

The MIAA currently conducts conference championships in eight men's and eight women's sports. Men's championships include football, cross country, basket-

ball, indoor and outdoor track and field, baseball, tennis, and golf. Women's champions are determined in volleyball, soccer, cross country, basketball, indoor and outdoor track and field, softball and tennis.

Ralph McFillen, formerly of the Metro and Gulf South conferences, succeeded Ken B. Jones as commissioner of the MIAA in July 1997.

Matt Newbery, previously the assistant sports information director at Pittsburg State University, is the assistant to the commissioner for media relations and in his 12th year with the MIAA.

Natasha Oakes, a former All-MIAA track performer at Emporia State University, was added as the third full-time staffer in July 2005 as the assistant to the commissioner for compliance.

Washburn Historical Highlights

1984 • This Lady Blues team posts the best winning percentage in team history at .711 (42-17). Sharon Lord and Sally Tracy are both named first-team all-district while Lord is further honored as second-team all-CSIC.

1985 • The Lady Blues set a school record for wins in a season with 45. Tami Dall sweeps first-team honors at the district and conference level. Vicki Jarnagin repeats as both first-team all-district and second-team all-conference.

1986 • The Lady Blues win their first-ever NAIA District 10 championship as Linda Moley is named district coach of the year. Washburn finishes 42-25 after losing a bi-district championship match to Southern Nazarene. Marilee Baumchen and Vicki Jarnagin are both named first-team all-district while Baumchen is further honored as first-team all-CSIC. Jarnagin is a second-team all-CSIC pick. The 42 wins ties for second most wins in a season.

1988 • Washburn plays host to the 20-team NAIA national volleyball tournament in Lee Arena.

1990 • Washburn enters its first MIAA postseason tournament as the fifth-seeded team. Shanna Haslett becomes the first Washburn player named first-team all-MIAA while Susan Waller is a second-team pick.

1993 • The Lady Blues proved to be one of the best defensive teams in not only the MIAA, but also NCAA Division II. Washburn led the MIAA in digs per game (21.53) while also finishing first in that category in NCAA Division II national stats compiled by the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA).

1996 • WU records first winning season since 1986. Head coach Kelly Osburn leaves the school as the all-time winningest coach in school history. WU knocks off nationally-ranked Central Missouri State at Warrensburg in the season finale.

1997 • First year head coach Allison Jones leads the Lady Blues to a second straight winning season and the highest ever finish in the MIAA (4th).

1998 • The Washburn Lady Blues program celebrated its 30th season of intercollegiate volleyball.

2000 • Washburn finished the season 24-12 and 9-7 in the MIAA to tie its highest conference finish in fourth place behind first team All-MIAA selection Jill Gassen.

2002 • Washburn wins first MIAA Championship and making first appearance in the NCAA Regional, which was hosted in Lee Arena. The 29-5 record was the best winning percentage in school history. Head Coach Chris Herron was named MIAA Coach of the Year.

2003 • Washburn opens the season with a school record 15-1 mark and beats national finalists North Alabama and Concordia-St. Paul. Dani McHenry becomes first WU player to be named All-American.

2004 • Washburn reaches the NCAA National Tournament for the second time in three years under head coach Chris Herron and finishes the season with a school-best national ranking of No. 16 in the AVCA Final Poll. Dani McHenry was named All-American for the second straight season as well as first team All-MIAA for the third time.
