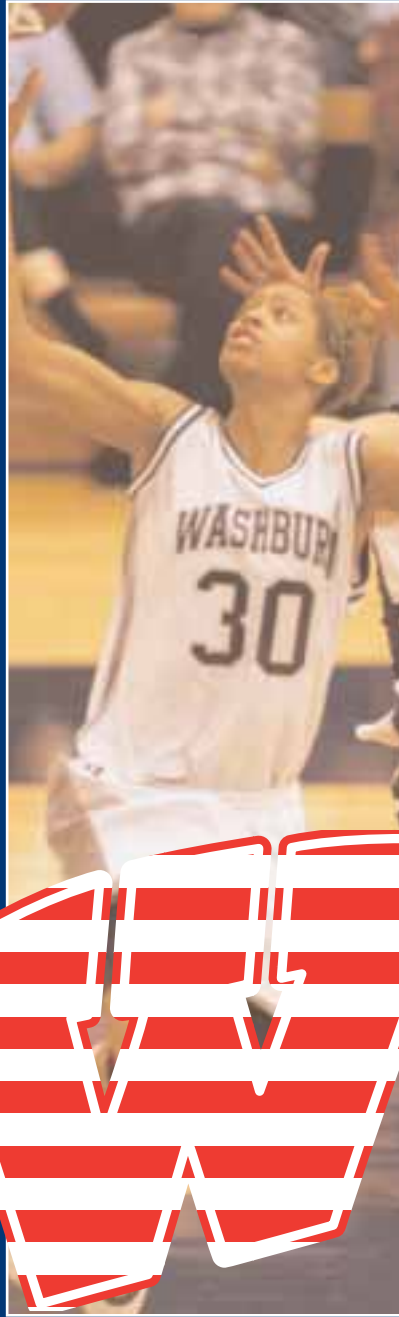

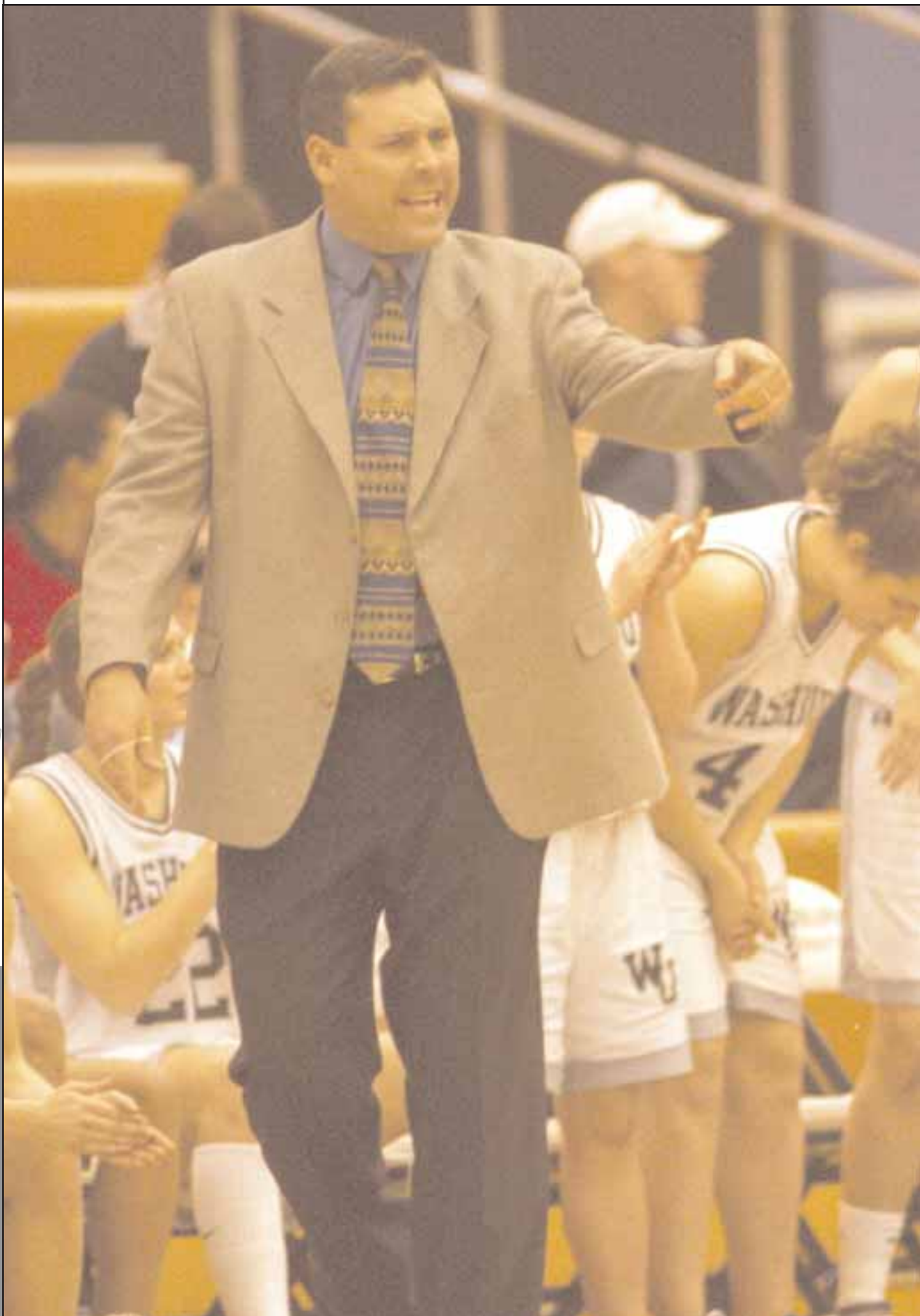

Ron McHenry begins his second season on the bench for the Lady Blues.

McHenry was named the head coach on May 8, 2000, taking over for Patty Dick, who retired in April.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

McHenry led Washburn to a 13-14 record in his first season, which was also his first season as a head coach at the collegiate level.

Prior to his new appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.



McHenry has had a diverse coaching career. He began his career as a graduate assistant to Chipman during the 1984-85 season. He then went on to Perry High School in 1986 where he served as assistant boys coach.

McHenry quickly moved up the coaching ranks in 1988 when he assumed an assistant's position with the Topeka Sizzlers of the Continental Basketball Association. McHenry eventually became the Sizzlers' interim head coach before joining the Washburn staff for the 1989-90 campaign. During his first year on the Washburn staff, McHenry was the department's academic advisor.

McHenry played for Washburn after stints at Coffeyville Community College and the University of Kansas. He started for the Ichabods during the 1983-84 season.

He graduated from Washburn with a bachelor's degree in communications and went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State University in 1987.

McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie. Danielle is a freshman on the University of Kansas volleyball team.

Lisa Curliss
Assistant Coach

Lisa Curliss was named the assistant women's basketball coach before the 2001-02 season.

Curliss, who played at Oral Roberts University from 1993-95, spent the past season as an assistant basketball coach at Norman High in Norman, Okla., where she was the 6A sophomore coach of the year.

Prior to her stint at Norman High, Curliss was a student assistant at the University of Oklahoma from 1998-2000. She earned her bachelor's degree in Electronic Media Broadcasting at Oklahoma in the spring of 2001.

While at Oklahoma under current Sooner coach Sherri Coale, Curliss helped coach the squad to a Big 12 title and a berth in the NCAA Sweet 16.

The Oklahoma City, Okla. native graduated from Westmore High, where she was an all-state selection and participated in the annual Oklahoma-Iowa game.



Jennifer Butcher
Student Assistant Coach

Jennifer Butcher joins the Lady Blues coaching staff after a stellar three-year career as a Lady Blue. Butcher joined the Lady Blues in 1998-99, after transferring from Wichita State.

Butcher earned All-MIAA honors each of the last two seasons. In 2000-01, she earned honorable mention honors with a 9.5 point and 7.4 rebound a game average. As a junior, she was on the second team, leading the Lady Blues in scoring at 14.7 points and 7.6 rebounds a game. She torched Pittsburg State for a career-high 33 points in Pittsburg Feb. 12, 2000. The 33-point total ties the ninth most points in a single game for a Washburn player.

After scoring 257 points last season, Butcher eclipsed the 1,000 point mark and finished her Washburn career 10th in school history with 1,098 points. She became the 15th Washburn player to reach the 1,000 point mark with a layup with 37 seconds remaining in a 65-61 victory over Missouri-Rolla on Jan. 27, 2001.

With her 200 rebound total last season, she moved into ninth place in Washburn history with 584 career rebounds.

She is a native of Olathe, Kan. and will earn her bachelor's degree in elementary education in May.



Jodi Rausch
Student Assistant Coach

Jodi Rausch joins the Lady Blues coaching staff after spending the last four seasons in a Washburn uniform.

Rausch finished her career in 20th place in Washburn history with 835 points, including 190 points last season. She also finished her career with 467 rebounds, which ranks No. 16 in team history.

During her junior year in 1999-2000 Rausch averaged 11.0 points and 4.2 rebounds a game to earn honorable mention All-MIAA honors. She scored a career-high 27 points in a victory against Truman State on Jan. 31 that season.

She came to Washburn from Garden Plain High School in Garden Plain, Kan., where she was named the Class 2A Player of the Year by averaging 23.5 points and 8.0 rebounds a game for the 17-1 Owls.

Rausch will earn a bachelor's degree in physical therapy in May.

The 2001-02 Washburn University Women's Basketball Media Guide is intended to provide information for writers, broadcasters, sports editors, sports information personnel and fans who follow the Lady Blues. Material in the guide was current as of the printing deadline of Oct. 23, 2001. Additional information is available in the Washburn Sports Information Office and through weekly releases available to personnel from accredited media outlets covering the Lady Blues.

Washburn University is in Topeka, Kan., at the intersection of 21st Street and Washburn Avenue. Lee Arena is located in the Petro Allied Health Center at the east edge of the Washburn campus. Parking for the facility is adjacent to Washburn Avenue.

The Washburn University Sports Information Office is located in room 352 of Whiting Fieldhouse. Office hours are from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Media credentials are available to personnel from accredited media outlets by contacting Brad Noller, Assistant Sports Information Director, Washburn University, Topeka, Kansas, 66621. Credentials are available 60 minutes before tipoff at the Will Call window at the northeast entrance of Lee Arena. All media seating in

the Lee Arena press box is reserved on a game-by-game basis and space is limited. Please contact the Sports Information Office at least four days before the game date to ensure a seat in the press box.

Radio stations wishing to broadcast from Lee Arena should make broadcast requests through the Sports Information Office at least one week prior. One courtesy line will be made available to the official station of each visiting team. Additional stations wishing to broadcast must install their own line. KWIC 99.3 FM is the official broadcast station of the Washburn Lady Blues.

Telephone lines for writers to file their stories are available in the Sports Information Office. There are two telephone for writers to file stories in the Lee Arena press box. Writers wishing to file via telephone lines should contact the Sports Information Office to make arrangements.

Media services include a game program and lineups, plus statistics and game notes for each team. Halftime stats are provided as well as individual and team stats and a play-by-play summary. Statistics are kept on the Automated Scorebook computer system by MRR Systems. Pizza and refreshments are available before each game.

Postgame interviews with Coach Ron McHenry are available to media personnel after his brief meeting with the team immediately following the game. Players will be brought, by request, to Lee Arena press box.

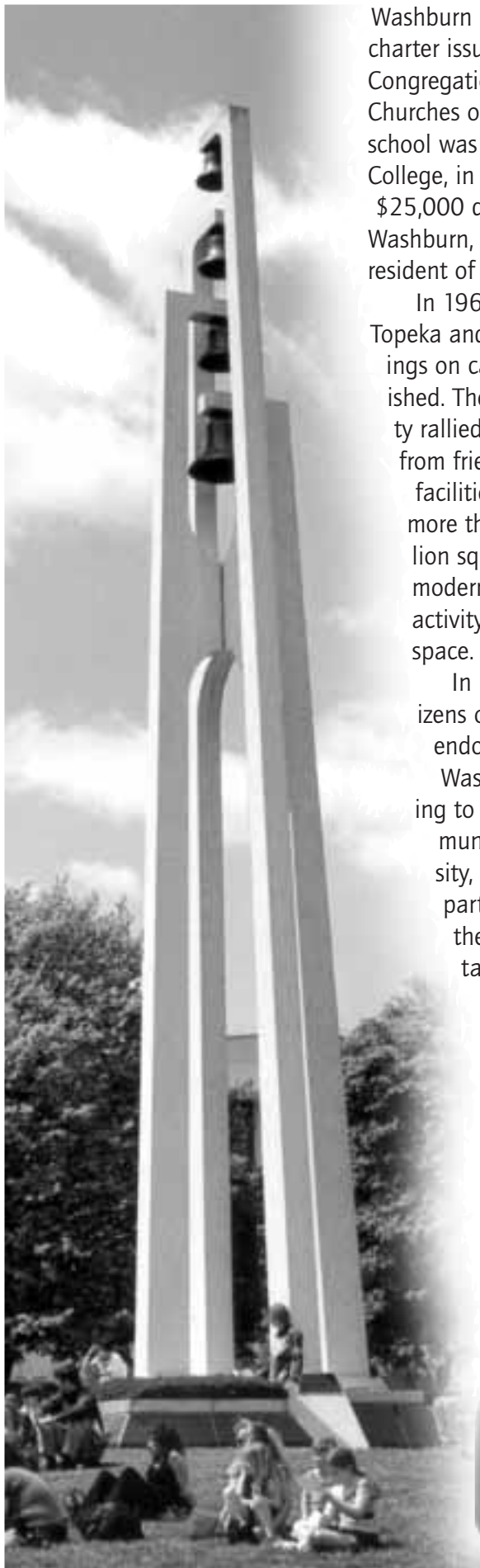

Washburn University was established in 1865 as Lincoln College by a charter issued by the state of Kansas and the General Association of Congregational Ministers and Churches of Kansas. In 1868, the school was renamed Washburn College, in recognition of a \$25,000 donation by Ichabod Washburn, a church deacon and resident of Worcester, Mass.

In 1966, a tornado struck Topeka and several historic buildings on campus were demolished. The Washburn community rallied and financial support from friends and alumni made possible the rebuilding of many school facilities during the coming years. Today, university facilities offer more than one million square feet of modern academic, activity and support space.

In 1941, the citizens of Topeka endorsed Washburn by voting to establish a municipal university, supported in

part by the city and governed by a local board of regents. In 1999, the university's primary funding was moved from the city property tax to county sales tax sources, with



the school retaining status as a municipal subdivision of the state. In addition to local financial support. Washburn has received state funds since 1961, which have been coordinated by the Kansas Board of Regents since 1991. Washburn is governed by a nine-member Board of Regents.



Washburn provides broadly-based liberal arts and professional education through more than 190 certificate, associate, baccalaureate, master's and juris doctor programs through the College of Arts and Sciences and the Schools of Law, Business, Nursing and Applied Studies. Ninety percent of the faculty hold a doctorate of the highest degree available in their discipline. Individual attention is a priority at Washburn, with a student to faculty ratio of 18 to 1.

Loren Ferre' became Washburn's director of athletics in February of 1996 after a six-year appointment at Black Hills State University in Spearfish, S.D. Ferre' is a dynamic leader who has implemented many internal changes within the athletic department since arriving on campus. Lee Arena has served as the home of Washburn basketball since the 1984-85 basketball season. The arena has a capacity of 4,000, twice that of Whiting Fieldhouse, which housed the home court before 1984.

The arena was built as part of the \$8.4 million Kelsey H. and Edna B. Petro Allied Health Center, the largest building on campus covering more than 126,000 square feet. Lee Arena is named after former Washburn baseball coach and player Bob Lee and his wife, Sallee, to recognize their \$250,000 donation.



Following the 2000-01 season, Lee Arena underwent its first construction work since it opened with the second level addition of new coaching offices, conference room, booster room and student-athlete computer room. The addition makes Lee Arena one of the best Division II complexes in the nation.

Lee Arena has provided an outstanding homecourt advantage for both the Ichabods and Lady Blues. Since the Lady Blues christened Lee Arena with an 89-65 victory over Friends on Nov. 20, 1984, the team has posted an overall home record of 199-50 (.799).

The recent success of the Washburn basketball teams

combined with an outstanding facility in Lee Arena has led the NCAA to select Washburn as a host site for postseason competition. The Lady Blues are 4-3 in NCAA postseason play at Lee Arena. On July 6, 1999, Lee Arena was fitted with a new basketball court design. The previous design was the original found on the court when Lee Arena opened for its first basketball game on Nov. 17, 1984.

The new court, which was designed by Sports Information Director Gene Cassell, features major changes, including a filled-in 3-point circle and an enlarged Washburn "W" in the center of the court.

Last season was full of ups and downs for first year head coach Ron McHenry and his squad.

His team fired out of the blocks early and jumped to a 6-1 record. However, the Lady Blues struggled with inconsistency and poor shooting during the remainder of the season and finished with a 13-14 record.

"That's something we tried to change," McHenry said. "We went out and got a good class of girls who can put the ball in the basket and I think that will help us tremendously."

The Lady Blues will be a young team this season. Out of the nine new players, six are true freshmen - all of whom are from Kansas except for Casper, Wyoming native Lora Westling.

This group will be scrutinized closely because this off-season was the first full recruiting season for McHenry.

"We'll be able to do some more things this year," McHenry said. "It's still too early to tell who we have as far as go-to players, but as far as being able to do more things out of offensive sets and things like that."

McHenry will look for leadership from his returning players. Of the seven returning, six saw significant playing time and five of them started at some point.

"That will be important for us," McHenry said. "We've got more than a couple girls on this team now who have been through the MIAA conference schedule at least once. I'll expect them to teach the new players what to expect during the season and I'll expect our seniors to show a 'ready to come and work hard every day' attitude.

"If we are going to be successful, we have to have that type of leadership, no matter what they do on the floor."

Getting on the floor may be tough this year for any of the Lady Blues.

This isn't a bad thing according to McHenry. In fact, he thinks the competition will only make his players better.

"We have six guards who can play and we've added some height down low," McHenry said. "The girls are going to have to prove themselves in practice and then show it in the game."

As is the case for any team at the start of the season, each of the Lady Blues will have to find a role within the team that allows for them to "show" themselves.



One way to step up may be to fill the spot Manhattan High product Ineke Ingram was expected to fill. Ingram tore the ACL in her right knee in September during off-season workouts and will miss the entire year.

"She would have added a scoring punch," McHenry said. "Ineke has an ability to go get her shot when she wants it. "But we do have some others who can score. From what I've seen, (Carissa) Goeglein is a good scorer and others will have to be as well."

Whether or not the Lady Blues shoot the ball consistently will be the determining factor for their success this year.

The defense was a solid fourth in the MIAA in points allowed (64.1 points per game). But the offense was ranked ninth averaging only 61 points every contest.

"We'll be a better team this year," McHenry said. "We won't have a 'steal and go score' defense but more of a 'settled in' defensive mind set and be tough to score on.

"Offensively, we have the players who can get their shots out of our system and they have the ability to put the ball in the basket."

GUARDS

Playing time will be up for grabs this season with the addition of several guards during the off-season.

The Lady Blues will be led by the returning back-court duo of Kristy Chapman and Bethany McGraw.

Both juniors this season, McGraw started all 27 games last season and Chapman led the team in scoring with 12.7 points per game.

Senior Sharina Watkins didn't start but appeared in all 27 games while averaging 12.4 minutes a game. Senior Linsey Moddelmog, who had a strong outing against Missouri Western in the final game last season, will also help lead the Lady Blues.

OUTLOOK

The Lady Blues hope a good returning nucleus of players and a solid recruiting class are the recipe for success in the MIAA for the 2001-02 season.

The Lady Blues looked competitive at times in the MIAA by defeating Central Missouri State and nearly beating the Emporia State Hornets on the road, but the team's consistency was the main concern.

Emporia State looks to extend its four-year reign as MIAA champions and return as the favorite, despite losing three starters and two other key members from last season.

The Hornets have reloaded with 1998-99 MIAA Freshman of the Year, Janel McNeal, who transferred from Missouri-Rolla, along with Louisiana Tech transfer Kristie McClain. McNeal and McClain join honorable mention all-MIAA selection Jamie Blakely and Deena Holloway.

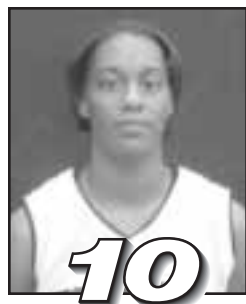

The Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association, a 10-member conference of NCAA Division II institutions in Missouri and Kansas, was first organized in 1912 as the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association.

The MIAA has gained the reputation of being one of the top NCAA Division II conferences in the nation. MIAA student-athletes have won nine national championships and more than 98 individual national titles.

The MIAA currently conducts conference championships in nine men's and seven women's sports. Men's champions

are crowned in football, cross country, basketball, indoor and outdoor track and field, baseball, tennis, and golf. Women's champions are determined in volleyball, cross country, basketball, indoor and outdoor track and field, soccer, softball and tennis.



Ralph McFillen was named to succeed Ken B. Jones as commissioner of the

MIAA in January 1997 and took over in July of that year. He formerly served as commissioner of the Metro and Gulf South conferences.

Matt Newbery, formerly an assistant sports information director at Pittsburg State University, joined the conference in July 1994 as director of sports information.

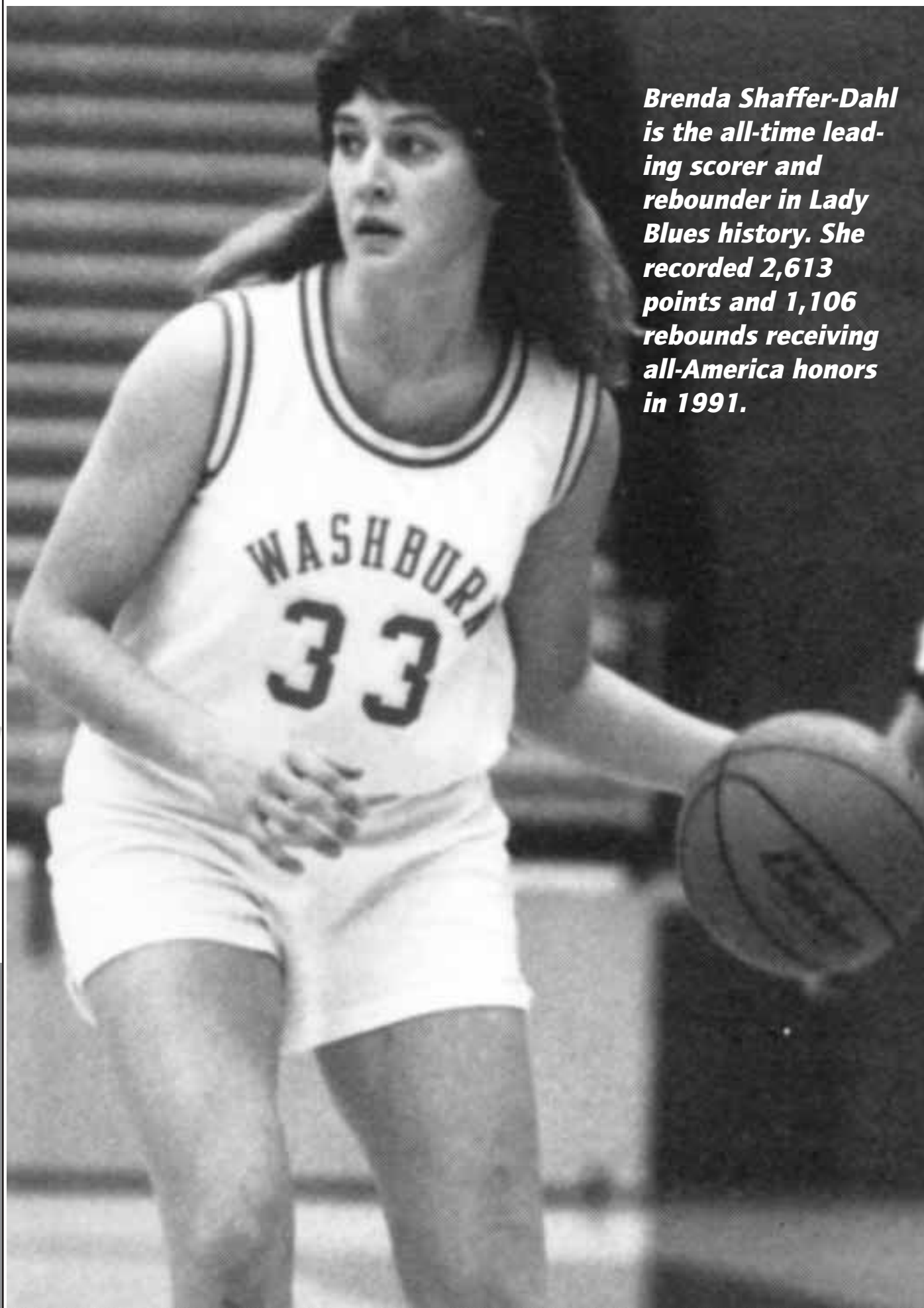

The 1992-93 Lady Blues

The 1992-93 season was full of firsts for Head Coach Patty Dick and her Lady Blues as the team enjoyed its best season in history.

The Lady Blues' first-ever undefeated regular season (26-0) was highlighted by the team's first No. 1 national ranking. That distinction came on Feb. 9, 1993, and the Lady Blues held onto the No. 1 spot for the remainder of the season.

Washburn won its first-ever MIAA regular season championship while claiming a postseason tournament crown for good measure.

The Lady Blues won their second straight NCAA South Central regional title to advance to the quar-

terfinals of the national tournament. It was in the quarterfinals that the Lady Blues suffered their only defeat of the season, losing, 78-77, in overtime to Michigan Tech, ending Washburn's season at 31-1.

The team set nine single-season Washburn team records, including wins (31), fewest losses (1), winning percentage (.969) and consecutive wins (31).

The squad also set team records for points scored (2,449), rebounds (1,341), free throws made (526) and free throw percentage (.773).

The Lady Blues also set or tied four MIAA records enroute to a sweep of league titles.
