HISTORY

March '70 to August '71 - Labor Coordinator

Duties and Responsibilities:

Assist in negotiating contracts with collective bargaining agencies.  
Assist in interpreting labor union contractual obligations.  
Study and interpret collective bargaining agreements and current labor market conditions.  
Assist in developing and organizing training programs including on the job training where necessary.  
Provide assistance and advice in the adjustment of employee grievances.

April '69 to March '70 - Concrete Superintendent, Northfield Dam and Underground Powerhouse Project, Northfield, Massachusetts

Duties and Responsibilities:

The scheduling and placement of all concrete, the finishers, the sandblasting, greencutting, curing, ordering of all concrete, patching and rubbing.

November '68 to April '69 - Swing Shift Superintendent, St. Lawrence Seaway, Messena, New York

Duties and Responsibilities:

On the swing shift was responsible for the removal of all rejected concrete walls, with 60 laborers using pavement breakers, replacement of all rebar with iron workers, reforming by carpenters, preparing all pours for the day shift, curing, sandblasting and greencutting concrete that was poured on the day shift.

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March '67 to November '68 - Concrete Superintendent, Iowa Ammunition Depot, Burlington, Iowa

Duties and Responsibilities:

Scheduling, ordering, placement, finish, curing, sandblasting and greencutting of all concrete plus some of the excavation work.

March '66 to March '67 - Deficiency Superintendent, Minuteman Missile Base, Great Falls, Montana

Duties and Responsibilities:

To see that all items on punch list were corrected with small crew of fitters, electricians, laborers, carpenters, finishers and sheet metal men before being turned over to the Air Force for final acceptance.

November '63 to March '66 - Concrete Superintendent and Deficiency Superintendent, Minuteman Missile Base, Grand Forks, North Dakota

Duties and Responsibilities:

Concrete duties and those of Deficiency Superintendent, same as above.

October '62 to November '63 - Deficiency Superintendent, Minuteman Missile Base, Cheyenne, Wyoming

Duties and Responsibilities:

To correct all items which are on punch list with all crafts necessary for final turnover and acceptance to the Air Force so that we could receive final payment for our work.

March '61 to October '62 - Excavation Superintendent, Concrete Superintendent and Deficiency Superintendent, Minuteman Missile Base, Sedalia, Missouri

Duties and Responsibilities:

Excavation of 150 support building foundations and pouring concrete on same, on a project which covered about 6,000 square miles of farmland in Missouri.

Excavated capsuled shaped control center, gunited these capsules after excavation.

Had crews remove rust, red lead the bare spots, and completely paint 150 metal lined shafts 91 feet deep and 12 feet in diameter. Duties of Deficiency Superintendent to have all imperfections in the construction of these Missile projects corrected to satisfaction of the Air Force before final payment.

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January '61 to March '61 - Excavation Superintendent, Minuteman Missile Base, Great Falls, Montana

Duties and Responsibilities:

Using Gradall, front-end loaders, backhoe and dozer excavated 50 support building foundations.

After these buildings were completed had crews backfill and cover these buildings which were all earth covered and not visible from the air.

June '59 to January '61 - Excavation foreman, labor general foreman, concrete foreman, Titan Missile Base, Denver, Colorado

Duties and Responsibilities:

This was another underground missile project where excavation was first, then came concrete, then the backfilling and covering of these structures with dirt, then the final cleanup and turnover to the Air Force.
