Washington State needs a Lieutenant Governor with experience, an understanding of the ghetto and the poor, and a desire to do something about the problems we all face.

I FEEL THAT with my 20 odd years of working with government agencies first as Legislative liaison for Governor Fred Hall of Kansas, later as a teacher in the Berkeley school system, and after I came to Pasco with the Manpower Development program. I am currently a Pasco City Councilman and the founder of the East Pasco Self-Help Cooperative Association. I seek the nomination on the Republican ticket.

The job of Lieutenant Governor can be meaningful. Opportunities are obvious in a state that is expanding economically at a fantastic rate, has the problems of a population boom, and the demands of war on poverty

and a struggle for civil rights. The Lieutenant Governor should have the responsibility to "do a job" in those areas.

PRESENTLY THE Lieutenant Governor has little to do. He could be working year-around on the serious problems facing our state. I propose to do this twelve months of the year, in a human and professional way, using self-help concepts, along with manpower development and executive administration in every corner of this state where needed.

I have already shown that today's problems can be met head on. I can communicate with the poor of all races. I can get groups started helping themselves with their own resources. I am asking you to help me to help others and to make the office of Lieutenant Governor a working part of government.
