Absentee ballots 220 counted—no effect

PROSSER — Tabulation of 220 absentee ballots in Benton County did not affect nomination of candidates nor issues in the primary election.

Warren D. Magnuson was top vote-getter for U.S. Senator with 383 votes. Jack Metcalf received 370 votes.

For state representative from District 8-B, Glenn Gunn received 116 votes.

Mary H. Aldrich, a Republican, received 117 votes for 16-A District state senator while Democratic incumbent Mike McCormack received 180 votes.

Diris J. Johnson, Democratic incumbent state representative for District 14-A, received 115 votes and challenger C. E. Evans, a Republican, 177 votes.

For Benton County Commissioner from District 1, Larry A. Kramer, a Republican, received 156 votes and his Democratic opponent E. J. Paulson, 102 votes.

Wes P. Brown, a Democrat, won the District 3 commissioner post with 115 votes against Democratic opponents Alfred Buchanan who had 32 votes and Jerome Clarke who had 30 votes.
